### **U. S. History** In Flags

They ran Stanley Bergman's idea up 18 flagpoles in Civic Center Plaza yesterday and everybody saluted.

The idea came to Bergman a year ago as he drove routinely to work past the bare, white poles surrounding the plaza fountain. Why not, he asked himself, a brave display of flags

Yesterday, to the sound of martial music and the applause of 1000 people, 18 flags were simulta-neously hoisted into a crackling Western

They ranged from Massachusetts' colonial banner, borrowed from the British navy and emblazoned with the word "Liberty," to the 50-star emblem of today.

Each flagpoie has a bronze tablet, composed by the 49-year-old businessman, describing the historical importance of the flag fluttering above.

The hour-long morning ceremonies yesterday were attended by Mayor John F. Shelley, members of the diplomatic corps, high-ranking military officers and officials of the Sertoma Internation, the service club which sponsored the idea on the urging of

Bergman himself was officially named Flag Commandant for the Permanent Committee for the Pavilion of American Flags.
