'The man who raised the Confederate battle flag in front of City Hall found himself manning the barricades as well yesterday.

Angry civil rights leaders -calling the Southern banner "a symbol of hate" demanded that it come down.

But Stanley Bergman, the 49-year-old businessman and Sertoma Club member who persuaded the city to turn the 18 bare flag poles in Civic Center Plaza into a "Pavi-lion of American Flags," stood his ground.

"I don't want to fight the Civil War all over again," he said, "but the flag should re-


"There are no political ov-ertones to this," Bergman said. "All the flags come from the history of America and, whether we like it or not, the Confederacy was a part of our history."






